- For open-ended questions, no mark should be awarded for YES/NO or TRUE/FALSE. The reason/substantiation/motivation is what should be considered.
- Where one word answers are required and the candidate gives a whole sentence, mark correct provided that the correct word is <u>underlined</u> /highlighted.
- When two facts/ points are required and a range is given, mark only the first two.
- For multiple choice questions, accept EITHER the letter corresponding to the correct answer OR the answer written out in full.
- Do not award ½ marks.
